We continue to be of opinion, that His Majesty is sufficiently recovered to be capable of exercising His high Functions; But there are still certain symptoms remaining, which make us apprehensive of a relapse, unless His Majesty will strictly and uniformly exert himself to correct those ideas which occasionally show themselves in his less guarded moments. For we can not conscientiously pronounce His Majesty to be out of danger of a relapse,

till those symptoms no longer exist.

We therefore think it our duty to express our opinion of the absolute necessity of His Majesty still conforming to medical guidance, till we can have the satisfaction of declaring that the recovery is perfect.







" to add to the Answer given to the 3^d Question


" That to the best of our recollection, We answered
