God grant these good news

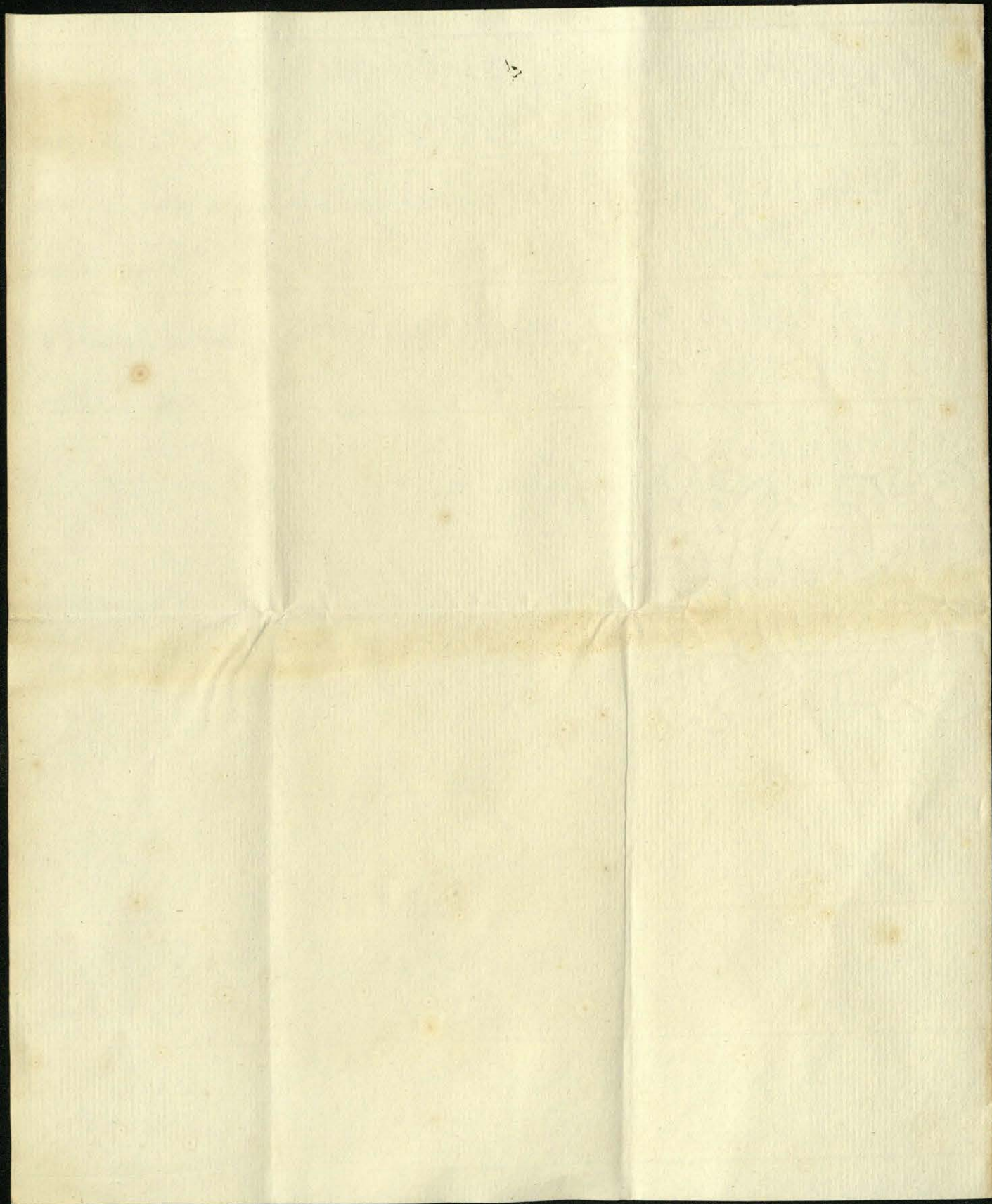

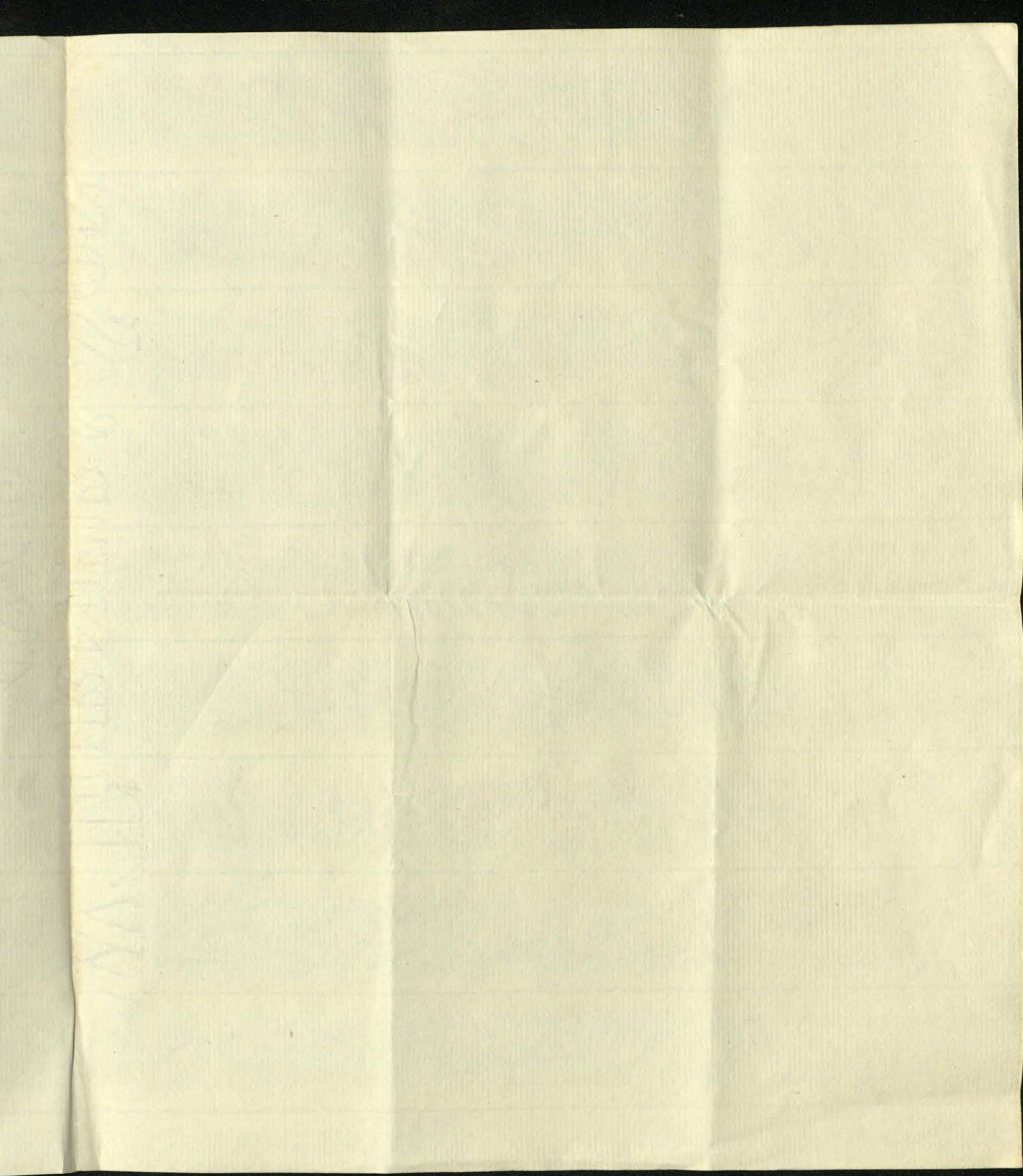
My dearest Brother

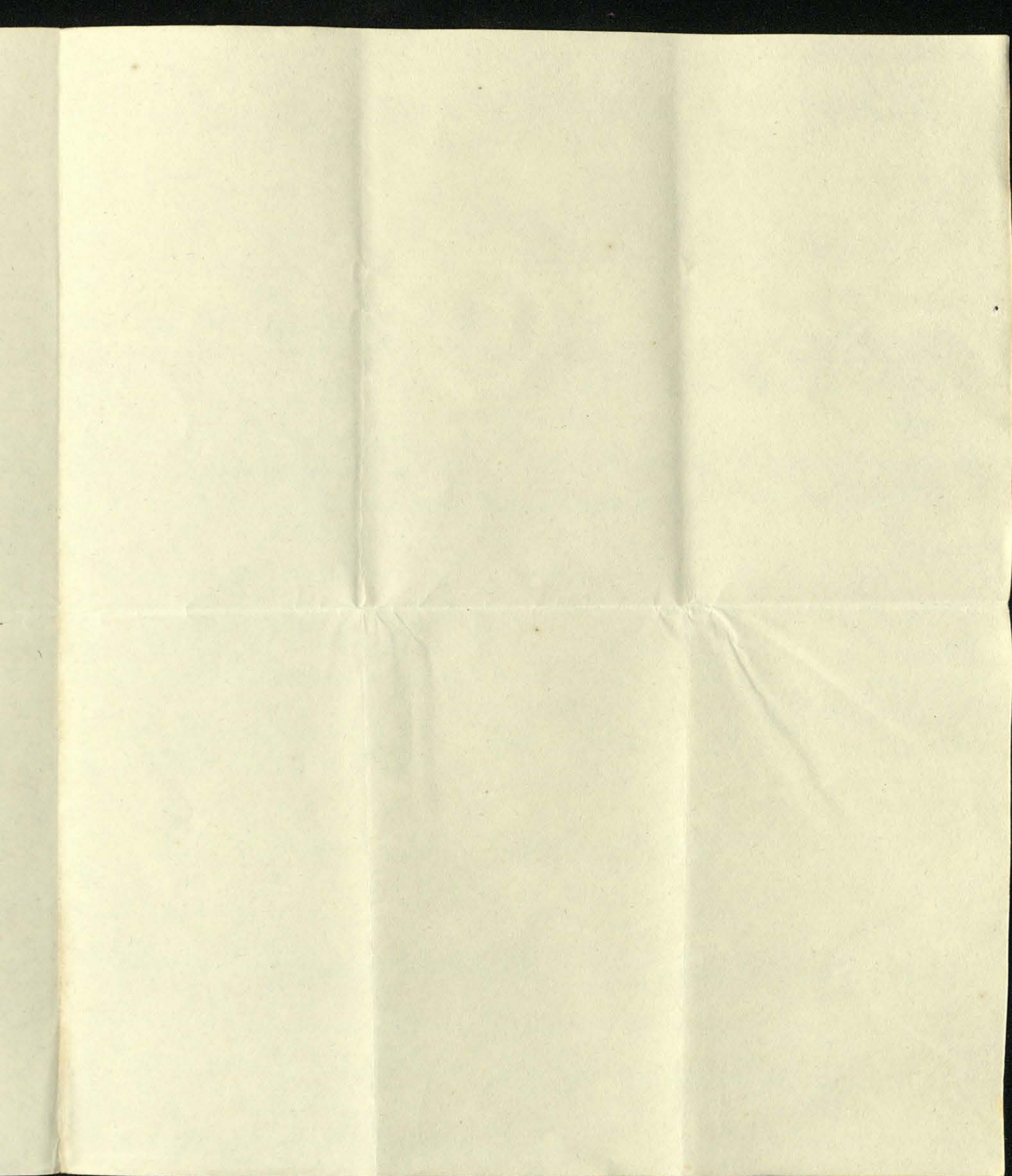

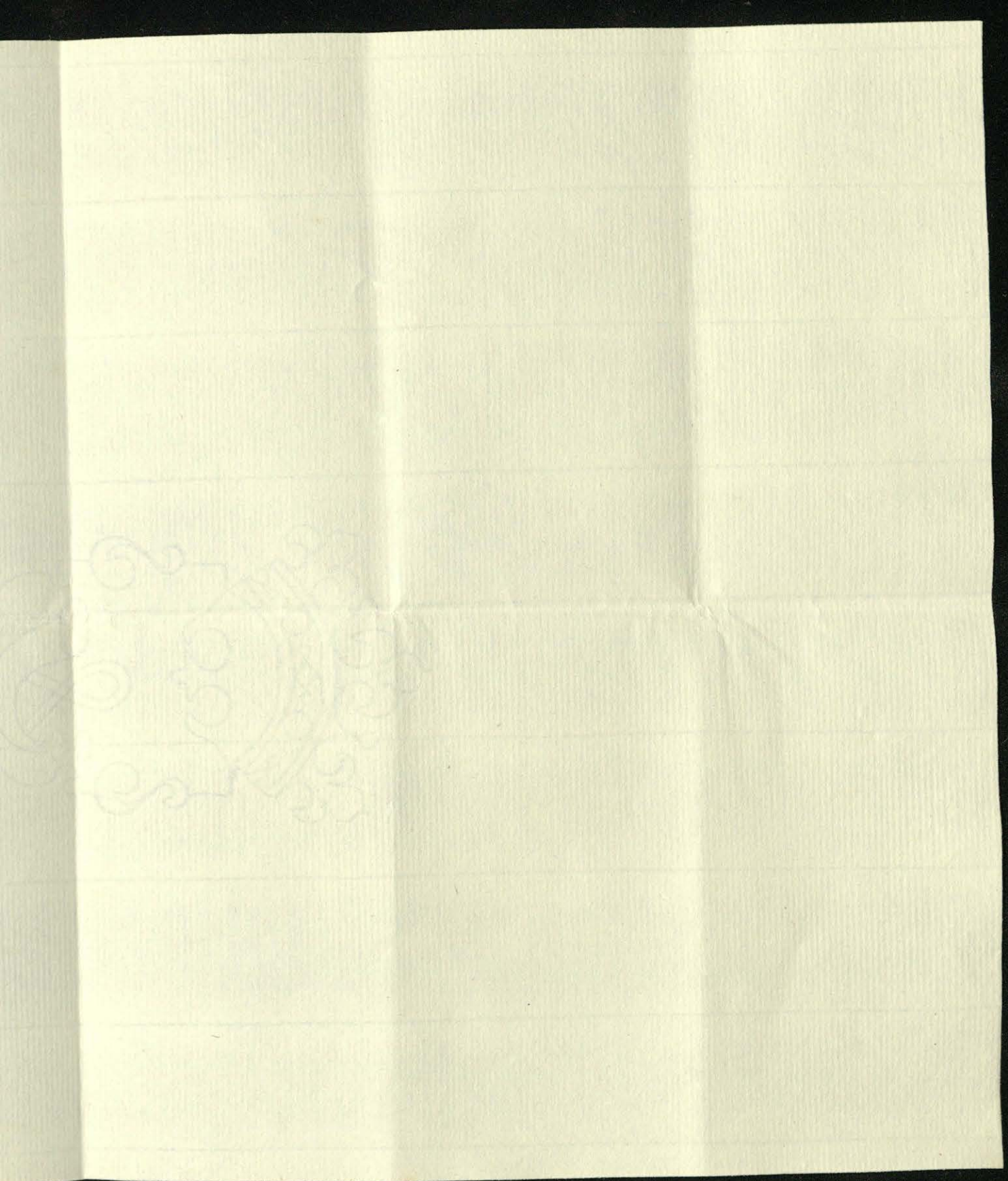

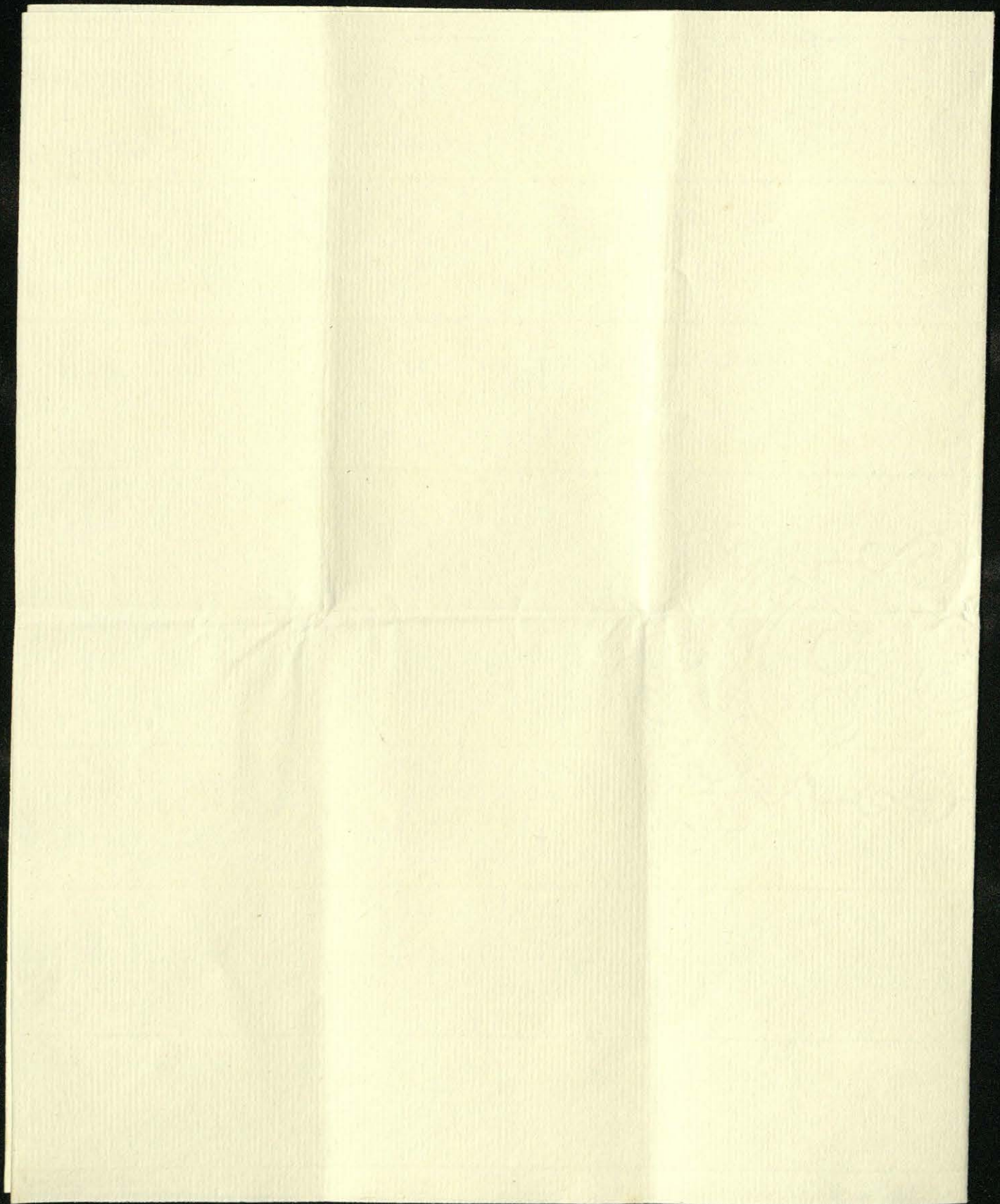
My dear Mother
