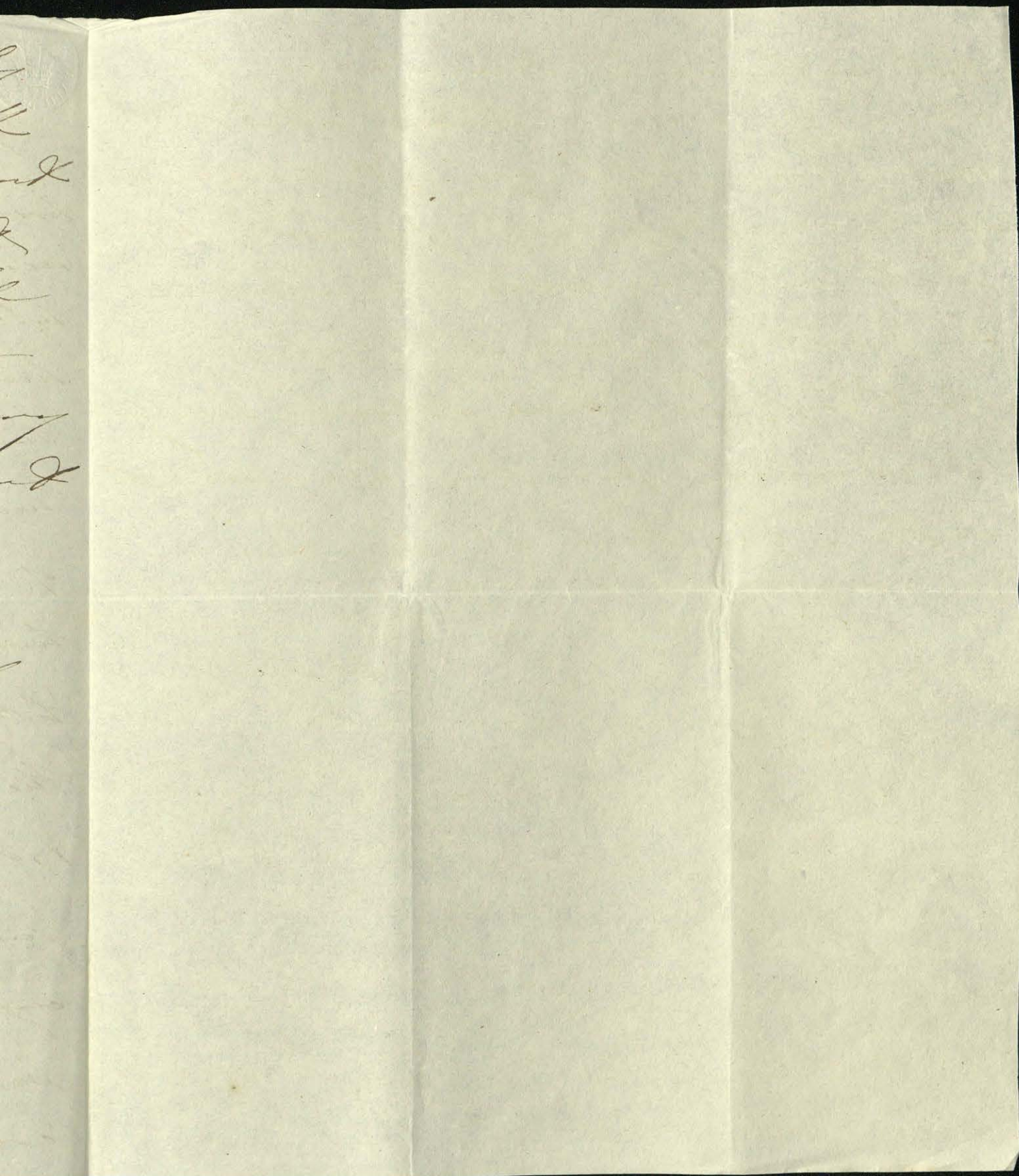
My dearest Brother

Sir

The King preserved the same silence which has been noticed for some time past, and paid the whole of yesterday in stillness and composure. On some occasions when it has been necessary to interrupt His Majesty, he has kindly observed that His thoughts were fully occupied, and we have no reason to believe that the subjects of His Majesty's meditation were such as would have engaged His attention in a less unhappy condition of His mind.

The King slept three hours and three quarters last night, but His Majesty had slept more than two hours in the course of the day in His chair.

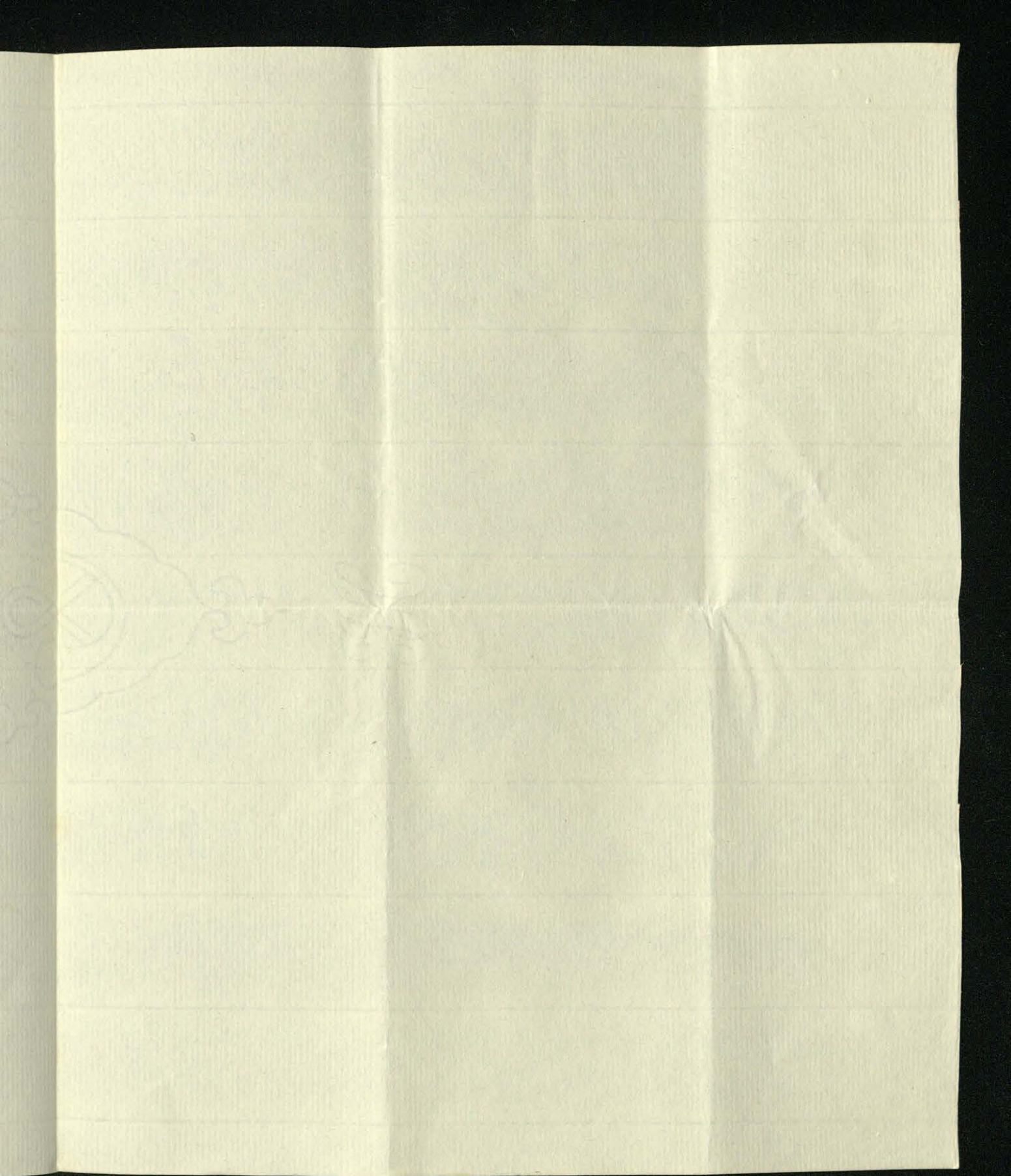
