Your Royal Highness. I fear, will look upon me as a very troublesome Correspondent for presuming to address a second Letter to you within the short space of ten days. But this at the desire of the Princess Charlotte that I now write to your Royal Highness. She has received so much benefit from the fine air of this place, and from her mode of life here, and feels herself also so much invigorated by basking in the sea, that she wishes much to continue at Weymouth for a few days longer or towards the close of the month, provided

this request does not interfere with any arrangements the Prince may have already made for her return.

When her Royal Highness mentioned her wishes to me, I recommended it most strongly to her to write to the Prince herself which I trust she will do by this Post.

I gave this advice upon the firm conviction that no opportunity should be lost of encouraging every approach to confidence on the part of the Prince ~~in his~~ Royal Highness.

I can venture to assure your Royal Highness that the Prince (Charlotte) continues to give the same symptoms of improved disposition, which I have remarked for some time past. In a late conversation her Royal Highness had with

General Gauth & myself, she said, she knew
it was her duty, but that it was also her incli-
nation, & should be her endeavour to please
the Prince in every thing. She declared she would
have nothing to do with Party, nor suffer her-
self to be influenced by any views or expecta-
tions contrary to his wishes.

God grant that her Royal High-
ness may persevere in cherishing these good
intentions - this virtuous disposition.
